* NOTES:

- The generated mapping is based on both archival data and secondary literature.
- The square shape within the legend represents the verified locus of the production and production-related activities, whereas the dots represent their unverified allocations.
- The author is aware that each historical map used as base map had a certain aim and thus differed in terms of levels of detailing. The objective of each phase map presented here is to reveal the location of the industries and not compare the level of detail drawn in each base map. It was, thus, not important to collect the base maps of the 5 phase maps based on the same map's type.
- Only those district names are written on this phase map that are referred to within the text. Their designation is based on their labelled names on the historical maps at the time, as well as their referring in archival publications.
- The author is fully aware of the possibility of misplaced or unmapped subject related activities.
